Slope

• Discuss with children how to approach the slope safely and the best way to traverse.

Manhole covers

- Check condition before session.
- Make group aware of potential trip hazard.
- If needs maintenance make caretaker aware by recording in book and do not use area.

Hedgerow

- Check condition before session.
- Be aware of seasonal changes to plants.
- No pick, no lick.
- Make on the spot risk assessments regarding amount of bees/wasps around the hedgerow.
- Be aware of any children or adults who may have allergies.

Learning Lodge

- Check condition of building and area before each session.
- Remove any litter or debris using gloves.

Forest

- Make children aware of trip hazards
- Be aware of low hanging objects e.g. at eye height- if needed mark any hazards with a bright string

Strangers

- Check the site before the session and remove any litter or debris using gloves.
- Be aware of the possibility of hazardous items e.g.: sharps.
- Remind the children of 'stranger danger'.

- Politely challenge any unauthorised persons near the site.
- Always carry a mobile phone with the office contact numbers.

Wild Animals

- Be aware that the fox may be active around the site.
- Avoid areas that it is using.
- Carry poo bags and check site for faeces before the session.
- Brief children on not touching any poo and telling an adult immediately.
- Children must inform an adult immediately if they see the fox and must be told not to approach it.
- If the fox is seen, recall all children and adults to the pre-agreed muster point for that session.

Old or dead trees

- Identify any old or dead trees and monitor.
- Encourage the group to identify old or dead trees and not use them for fastening or climbing.

Ticks

- Educate children and adults on the risks of tick bites and how to avoid this.
- Ensure adults and children have long socks, trousers and long sleeved tops on to reduce the risk of tick bites.
- Advise parents and adults as to the identification, checking and treating of tick bites.
- Lymes Disease information poster to readily available.

Toxic plants and fungi (see Natural Materials Risk Assessment)

- Check the site before each session and identify any hazards.
- Maintain up to date identification resources.
- Be prepared to avoid areas during activities.
- Make children in the group aware of any hazards.

Inclement weather (see Poor Weather Procedures)

- Before each session the local weather forecast will be checked.
- On the spot risk assessments will be made if the weather conditions change.
- All adults to be aware that weather conditions can change suddenly.
- All participants should be adequately prepared for any weather.
