### **Year 1 Children Searching for Cocoa the Bear**

As you may know, Cocoa the bear went missing from school! We were going to put a message on the Flier today asking for your help to find him but Mrs Dean was incredibly busy and asked the children to help her write something. This produced some beautiful writing which will be published on our Facebook page. Luckily Cocoa has been found safe and sound. He has since sent in a postcard showing him and some of his friends having fun on the beach. Naughty Cocoa for leaving without telling us where he was going!!

### **Head Lice**

We have had a number of reported cases across the school, particularly in Year R. Please check your child's head over the weekend and treat as necessary. We are still advised that the most effective way of removing head lice is using the wet-combing method as described below.

- Wash the hair using ordinary shampoo and apply ample conditioner, before using a wide-toothed comb to straighten and untangle the hair
- Once the comb moves freely through the hair without dragging, switch to the louse detection comb.
  Make sure that the teeth of the coomb slot into the hair at the roots with the bevel-edge of the teeth lightly touching the scalp
- Draw the comb down to the ends of the hair with every stroke and check the comb for lice
- Remove lice by wiping or rinsing the comb
- Work methodically through the hair section by section so that the whole head of hair is combed through
- Rinse out conditioner and repeat the combing procedure on the wet hair
- Repeat the procedure on day five, nine and thirteen in order to clear the young lice as they hatch, before they have had time to reach maturity.
  It is extremely important that you repeat on the days advised above.
