This summer at your local library, your child can take part in "Space Chase", this year's Summer Reading Challenge. The aim of the challenge is to get children aged 4 to 11 to read six books from their local library (or share them with an adult) over the summer holidays.

Chase". The challenge will run from 13 July to 15 September. Bookmarks giving full details have been sent home today. Children will help the Rockets track down books that have been nabbed by aliens. Attendance

As long as the children continue to remain healthy for the next two days, I am pleased to be able to inform you that 102 children achieved 100% attendance this term, with no more than three late marks. There were 22 children who achieved 100% attendance for the whole year, with no more than three late marks per term.

Parents of children in Year 1 and Year 2 in September - arrival arrangements for the first day of the Autumn Term

Year 2 children should arrive at 8.45am and go straight to their classes with all their belongings. Teachers will then direct them to their coat pegs and show them where to put their things away once they have been registered.

Year 1 children should arrive **at 9.00am on the first morning only**; entry into school is by the North and South Doors. The children should go straight to their class with their belongings and their teachers will help them to put their things away when registers have been completed.

If it is raining, then parents who have children in both year groups are invited to wait in the hall with Year 1 children after dropping off children in Year 2. Otherwise we would be grateful if you would help us by waiting on the playground.

In this way we hope to start the new academic year in a calm and positive way for both the children and yourselves.

Reminder of Collection Arrangements For all Classes In September

Year R children through individual classroom doors.

Year 1 children

Blackbirds: through Robins' class door into the small playground.

Doves: through the ICT suite door.

Woodpeckers: through the door closest to main gates (South Door).

Year 2 children

Kestrels and Owls: through the main door adjacent to Owls' class (North Door). **Eagles:** through the door closest to main gates (South Door).
