Sugar Swap Workshop

On Tuesday 17 March, our school nurses will be delivering 'Sugar Swap' workshops to each of our Year 1 classes however this will be opened up to all other classes at the end of the day, should you wish to come along. The workshops comprise of:

- Scanning food products to look at the sugar/fat/salt content
- Weighing foods to understand appropriate portion sizes
- Looking at a range of biology-type activities that show us how sugar can affect our bodies
- Food tasting and making healthier food substitutes

We hope in the near future, to be able to introduce similar sessions in both our foundation stage and Year 2 classes. In the meantime, however, should you wish to visit the ICT suite with your child (regardless of their year group) to explore the workshops yourselves, please do come along! Our school nurses will leave the workshops set up and will be available to speak with you at the end of the school day. As this falls on the same day as our cake sale, we suggest you enter the school via the ICT suite door (between the North door and Kingfishers' door via the playground). This we hope, will avoid the crowds of parents and children wishing to attend the cake sale via the main entrance door. Please do feel free to the move through the school afterwards to the hall, should you wish to treat yourself with something a little less healthy from our cake sale! **N.B – We ask that you remain with your child at all times and monitor their food consumption should they have dietary requirements or allergies, thank you.**

Head Lice

We have had a number of reported cases across the school, particularly in Kestrels' Class. Please check your child's head over the weekend and treat as necessary. We are still advised that the most effective way of removing head lice is using the wet-combing method as described below.

- Wash the hair using ordinary shampoo and apply ample conditioner, before using a wide-toothed comb to straighten and untangle the hair
- Once the comb moves freely through the hair without dragging, switch to the louse detection comb. Make sure that the teeth of the comb slot into the hair at the roots with the bevel-edge of the teeth lightly touching the scalp
- Draw the comb down to the ends of the hair with every stroke and check the comb for lice
- Remove lice by wiping or rinsing the comb
- Work methodically through the hair section by section so that the whole head of hair is combed through
- Rinse out conditioner and repeat the combing procedure on the wet hair
- Repeat the procedure on day **five**, **nine and thirteen** in order to clear the young lice as they hatch, before they have had time to reach maturity. **It is extremely important that you repeat on the days advised above**.
