## Writing Tasks

Draw a picture of your house and label it.

Write sentences using adjectives to describe a room in your house.

Hide and seek: Write a set of instructions on how to find something in your bedroom. Think about the positional language to help find the object.

Draw a map of one of the rooms in your house. What symbols could you have? Where will you place items?

When the children are writing, we would expect them to use capital letters and full stops fairly accurately. We have noticed lots of them are not doing this and would value your support to keep this important skill going while away from school.



## Reading Tasks

Reading a variety of books at home. This can be reading a book aloud everyday or sharing a book with an adult.
