



Reading

1. Continue to work through the weekly phonics lessons online (blending and segmenting: <https://www.youtube.com/playlist?list=PLuGr6z2H2KNGIYp03sdzSGLZquzuQENkx> / digraphs: <https://www.youtube.com/playlist?list=PLuGr6z2H2KNG4XgGr7UylwowlcDLr-T-k>), Oxford Owl (if your child is finding these easy now, try them on a harder level) and the phonics activities on the school website.
2. Go on a Teddy Word hunt through a book you are reading. Which book has the most Teddy Words in?
3. Talk about the answers to the Jack and the Beanstalk comprehension (see link on website).

Writing

1. She followed all of your instructions and Mrs Craig's egg has hatched! She now has a baby dragon and doesn't know what to do! Can you write some instructions to help her know where to keep it, what to feed it and how she should look after it? Remember to use First, Next, Then, After that and Finally.



2. Remembering the story of Jack and the Beanstalk, can you re-write it yourself? You could even change one part (the character, setting, problem or solution) if you want an extra challenge. Perhaps Freddie could climb up the beanstalk, or Jack could come across a lion instead of a giant!
3. Choose a tricky word from the list: he, she, me, we, be, you, was, my and write it correctly in a sentence. (If your child can spell those words choose one from the next Teddy card.
4. This is the last week that we will be learning about castles, so you could write an invitation to a celebratory banquet for your family. Make sure to tell them when and where it will be. You could even theme it or make it fancy dress!
