

WAGOLL: Comparing a domestic cat to a wild cat.

Many people do not realise that domestic cats are like the big cats that live in the wild. They **both** have a great sense of smell **and** they are both carnivores. This means that both types of cats are meat eaters. **As well as** food and smell, **both** types of cats stalk their prey **and** like to play with it before they eat it.
