

#### **Year 1/Year 2 Parental Consultations**

The feedback we have received from parents was very positive and that these consultations were very useful, albeit in a different format this year. The last of these consultations are due to take place on Monday 19 October. If for any reason you were unable to make one of our virtual consultations, please can you speak to your child's class teacher.

#### **Reminder: Harvest Festival**

This year we are once again supporting Waterlooville Food Bank. We would be grateful to receive donations of **non-perishable** food items from **Monday 19 October – Friday 23 October.** As with everything, we are having to change how we do things. Instead of the children bringing the food into their classrooms, we will have collection points along the main pathway every morning of that week. The Reverend Matt Grove will be running virtual Harvest Assemblies on Tuesday 20 October for the children.

Food items will be collected by Waterlooville Food Bank and will be distributed to people in the local area who, because of a crisis in their lives are struggling to provide for themselves and/or their families.

#### **Head Lice**

We have had a number of reported cases across the school, particularly in Year R. Please check your child's head over the weekend and treat as necessary. We are still advised that the most effective way of removing head lice is using the wetcombing method as described below.

- Wash the hair using ordinary shampoo and apply ample conditioner, before using a wide-toothed comb to straighten and untangle the hair
- Once the comb moves freely through the hair without dragging, switch to the louse detection comb. Make sure that the
  teeth of the coomb slot into the hair at the roots with the bevel-edge of the teeth lightly touching the scalp
- Draw the comb down to the ends of the hair with every stroke and check the comb for lice
- Remove lice by wiping or rinsing the comb
- Work methodically through the hair section by section so that the whole head of hair is combed through
- Rinse out conditioner and repeat the combing procedure on the wet hair
- Repeat the procedure on day **five, nine and thirteen** in order to clear the young lice as they hatch, before they have had time to reach maturity. **It is extremely important that you repeat on the days advised above.**
