Year R

Please note that as from Monday 02 November the start time will now be 9.00am - 9:10am for all children. This is to ensure that children's learning time is maximised as they are now able to come into school fully independently. As the children have now fully settled into Year R, please can we ask that parents leave their child at the door if possible as we do still have some parents who are coming in every day to talk to class teachers and this impacts on the support we can offer the children in the morning. We appreciate that sometimes it is necessary to speak to your child's teacher in the morning, but this should be for urgent messages only. For all other queries, please can we ask that you use Tapestry to communicate with your child's class teacher.

At this time of the year we would normally be inviting parents in to attend a" six weeks in" meeting. Unfortunately, this is not possible. We will therefore be providing this meeting in a video format and this will be shared on Facebook during the first week back with information on ways to support your child at home. If parents have any questions that they would like addressed, they can message us on tapestry and they will make sure to include them, no matter how small or inconsequential they may seem as many parents are probably wondering the same things!

Parental Consultations: These will take place next half term via Zoom and information will be sent out shortly after we return after the half term break.
