## <u>English:</u>

We are going to be learning about riddles over the next few weeks, focusing on animals. At home...

- You could read some riddles
- You could give each other clues to guess an object

## <u>Maths:</u>

We are going to learn to recognise odd and even numbers. We will talk about how even numbers all have a partner. This is particularly clear using numicon shapes:

• Practice pairing up a number of objects to check if it is odd or even. You could use pieces of pasta or Lego blocks or anything else you have handy!

## Wider Curriculum:

**Science**: We are going to compare our feet with a partner, make predictions about who will have larger feet and make observations to see if our ideas are correct.
