Geographical Skills and Fieldwork Interpret a range of sources of geographical information, incl maps diagrams, globes, aerial photos and CIS	Investigate a variety of maps eg, Ordnance Survey, QE Country Park, Staunton Farm, and identify common features eg roads, trees, houses, and the key
Geographical Skills and Fieldwork Communicate geographical information in a variety of ways, including through maps, numerical and quantitative skills and writing at length.	Draw a simple map, to include paths/roads, buildings, plants and a simple key.
