Question to explore	Can baking bread change a city?
Geographical Coverage	Countries and capitals of the UK
NC Coverage	<ul> <li>Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries</li> </ul>
	Name the 4 countries and capital cities
Locational Geography	Look at UK map and identify 4 UK countries. Refer back to weather/climate – which do they think would be the hottest country?
Incl contextual knowledge of globally	Locate 4 capital cities, and learn.
significant places	
Place Knowledge	Why is London where it is in England? Discuss River Thames, trade via shipping. Where are the most important buildings within London?
Human and Physical Geography	Discuss different important buildings within London eg St Pauls Cathedral, Houses of Parliament.
Incl the processes behind their creation and	Look at how London has grown in size over the years.
how they bring about variation and change	
over time	
Geographical Skills and Fieldwork	Take weather readings on a weekly basis, eg Monday, weather (sunny, cloudy, raining), rain gauge, wind vane, thermometer.
collect, analyse and communicate data	Look at daily weather patterns – it is getting hotter, rainier, windier?
through fieldwork	
Geographical Skills and Fieldwork	Look at maps and aerial photos of London, past and present. Use Google Earth timeline to scroll through the ages.
Interpret a range of sources of geographical	
information, incl maps diagrams, globes, aerial	
photos and CIS	
Geographical Skills and Fieldwork	Label a simple map of the UK with country name and capital city.
