Question to explore...	Can baking bread change a city?
Geographical Coverage	Countries and capitals of the UK
NC Coverage	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries • Name the 4 countries and capital cities
Locational Geography Incl contextual knowledge of globally significant places	Look at UK map and identify 4 UK countries. Refer back to weather/climate – which do they think would be the hottest country? Locate 4 capital cities, and learn.
Place Knowledge	Why is London where it is in England? Discuss River Thames, trade via shipping. Where are the most important buildings within London?
Human and Physical Geography Incl the processes behind their creation and how they bring about variation and change over time	Discuss different important buildings within London eg St Pauls Cathedral, Houses of Parliament. Look at how London has grown in size over the years.
Geographical Skills and Fieldwork collect, analyse and communicate data through fieldwork	Take weather readings on a weekly basis, eg Monday, weather (sunny, cloudy, raining), rain gauge, wind vane, thermometer. Look at daily weather patterns – it is getting hotter, rainier, windier?
Geographical Skills and Fieldwork Interpret a range of sources of geographical information, incl maps diagrams, globes, aerial photos and CIS	Look at maps and aerial photos of London, past and present. Use Google Earth timeline to scroll through the ages.
Geographical Skills and Fieldwork Communicate geographical information in a variety of ways, including through maps, numerical and quantitative skills and writing at length.	Label a simple map of the UK with country name and capital city.
Key Geographical Vocabulary - discuss and remember and embed	City: a large town usually containing a Cathedral Town: a built up area including houses, shops and offices, size between a city and a village Village: a group of houses Office: a room or building where people work Port: a town or city with access to water where ships can load and unload Harbour: a place on the coast where ships can moor in shelter Shop: a building where goods or services are sold
