Geographical Coverage	Comparing local areas Local Study Emsworth
NC Coverage	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the United Kingdom
Locational Geography Incl contextual knowledge of globally significant places	Look at map of Hampshire and identify Purbrook, Portsmouth and Emsworth. Briefly look at transport links between Purbrook and Emsworth.
Place Knowledge	Where is Emswoth? (on the sea) Look at proximity to Portsmouth.
Human and Physical Geography Incl the processes behind their creation and how they bring about variation and change over time	Investigate types of shop in Emsworth. Does it need really big shops? Look at recreational facilities, why does it have sailing club, etc.
Geographical Skills and Fieldwork collect, analyse and communicate data through fieldwork	Take weather readings on a weekly basis, eg Monday, weather (sunny, cloudy, raining), rain gauge, wind vane, thermometer. Look at seasonal weather patterns – it is getting hotter, rainier, windier than when it was winter?
Geographical Skills and Fieldwork Interpret a range of sources of geographical information, incl maps diagrams, globes, aerial photos and CIS	Look at maps of Emsworth, identify common features eg roads, trees, houses, and the key
Geographical Skills and Fieldwork Communicate geographical information in a variety of ways, including through maps, numerical and quantitative skills and writing at length.	Complete a table on types of shop on high street, eg shops selling food = 3, shops selling clothes = 2, etc
Key Geographical Vocabulary - discuss and remember and embed	Beach: a pebbly or sandy shore between high- and low-water marks Coast: the part of the land adjoining or near the sea



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
