

Starting School in September 2024

If your child is 4 or will turn before 1 September 2024, they can start school in September. If you have not already applied for a place, you need to do so by Monday 15 January. Hampshire residents should apply via the online portal: www.hants.gov.uk/admissions. Other residents should apply to their own Council, for example Portsmouth City Council or West Sussex Council.

Opportunity to try a School Lunch – Thursday 18 January

Next Thursday the school caterers are providing the children with the opportunity to sample a school lunch and samples of other lunch options. The choices available are:

- Baked Fish Fingers served with chips and vegetables of the day or:
- Sweet potato and lentil curry with a blend of brown and white rice
- Shortbread
- Tasters items of pizza and vegetable goujons will also be on offer

All children will automatically be signed up for this lunch. However, they may also bring in their own packed lunch but still sample items on offer. There will be no pressure to taste the food, it will be on the table and they can try any of the food items they wish.

Change of Lunch Option: Friday 19 January

The choices available are:

- Sliced beef and Yorkshire pudding served with roast and vegetables of the day or:
- Quorn chicken pieces in a Yorkshire pudding served with roast and vegetables of the day
- Lemon drizzle sponge

It is usually safe for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild illnesses, like a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should stay at home if they have a high temperature of 38C or above. The NHS has published guidance to help parents and carers decide whether their child is well enough to attend school, which we have been asked to share with our parents.
